

Individuals and representatives from church-related groups and networks involved in peace work are encouraged to apply to participate in the IEPC. As there are a limited number of places available, priority will be given to persons:

- involved in peace work that can bring input from their own church and/or context:
- knowledgeable about their area of peace work, dynamic players when engaging with other peace actors and able to facilitate and nurture discussions on issues relating to overcoming violence;
- committed to take back to their home context and put into action the message and learnings of the IEPC;
- engaged in an area of influence where they can make a difference, e.g. leadership positions in churches or activists at grassroots level in justice and peace movements.

Applicants representing a church-related group or network are requested to send an endorsement or recommendation letter from their church or organization.

Respect for ensuring an inclusive and balanced participation will be taken into consideration in the areas of women, youth and geographical region. The deadline for applications is **15 October 2010**, confirmations will be sent by **15 November 2010**. An application form may be found here:

## Costs

The registration fee is **CHF200** and covers:

- local transportation from the airport to the venue, campus of the University of the West Indies, and return;
- excursions to local projects, church services, public event(s);
