Archbishop Christodoulos of Athens


The head of the Church of Greece who invited the conference, is welcoming the event with a message on Tuesday morning. A full profile of this church leader is inside.

Aside from the plenary sessions, about 70 workshops, or synaxei, will meet during the week. The conference will also be richly liturgical and spiritual: morning home groups will meditate on biblical texts in the Lectio Divina tradition. will offer a space for individual or group prayer. A team of counsellors will be permanently available for pastoral care and spiritual orientation.

650 people from 105 countries

The 13th world mission conference is the first WCC world mission conference to be held in a predominantly Orthodox context. The WCC CWME has invited people from all continents and all major Christian denominations to the 13th world mission conference. Around 700 people from 105 countries are expected to gather in Athens to exchange their experiences.
